The disorganised mind: All about ADHD Workshop was conducted on 11th May 2017 at Max Hospital Patparganj, Delhi.

Demonstrator & Presenter:

Dr. Ashima, a Senior Consultant, clinical psychologist who deals with difficulties among children as well as adults, has an experience of 17 years. She has stressed about the need of such a wide variety in this area for a healthy society.

Agenda:

- Introduction and keeping an eye about the deficit hyperactive disorder among school going children.
- Techniques to deal children suffering from deficit hyperactive disorder.
- Case Studies of such problems with its proper solutions.

Delegates

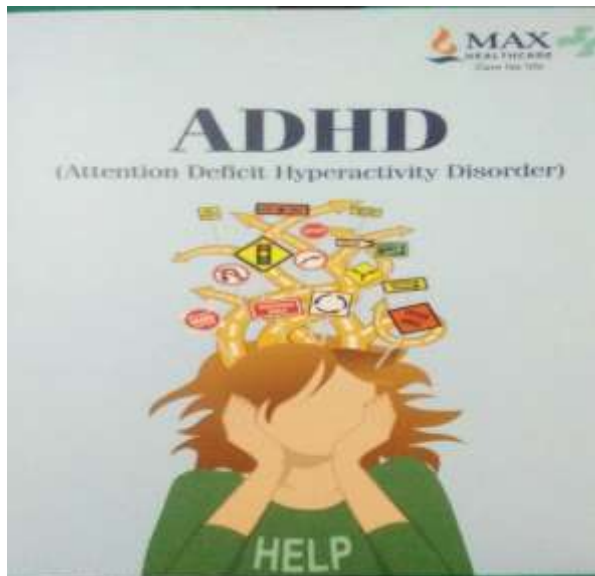
- Special Educators and Counsellors from schools of Delhi and Noida.

Highlights:

- Started an interactive session with Ice breaking game.
- Conducted and discussed the activities based on how memory works to live regular life.
- Modification of the activity was done by asking the delegates to stand in a circle and name any object and then pass it to other person with a new word.
- Made all the delegates to play a game that helps enhancing concentration power.
- Gave a precise difference between attention deficit hyperactive disorder and attention deficit disorder along with the terms like Hyperactivity, impulsivity and inattention.
- Stressed that counsellor should maintain principle of mirroring the students who are in need of extra attention.
- Discussed the history of ADHD and emphasized about its treatments.
- Performed a role play based on stereotype associated with ADHD
- Discussed the role of teachers and counsellors in school and their strategies to deal with ADHD in school environment.
- Stressed on the need to maintaining a good rapport with CWSN.
- Skit was presented by delegates on a case study
- Stressed on the need for holistic development of the child.
- Concluded by answering the questions put up by various delegates

Outcome:

- Became aware of the various classroom management techniques.
- Got familiar with the practical activities and games which can be applied for ADHD students.
- Learnt the criteria to assess a child with ADHD.
- Awaken about the major difference between a typical brain and brain with ADHD.
