Aggarwal discussed the methodology and concepts of a few important topics of grade XII - Relation Functions, Probability, Permutations and Combinations etc. and solved various queries of the attendees. The Resource Person also discussed the new scheme of marking set by CBSE for XII Mathematics question paper - the key feature being the introduction of 2 marks questions. Henceforth there will be 29 questions (1x4, 2x8, 4x11 & 6x6) in the Mathematics XII Board examination. The session was highly interactive and all the teachers were engrossed in discussions related to the topics. The programme proved to be a good learning experience for the teachers.
